NDLAMBE AWARDED TWO BLUE FLAG BEACHES

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In an impressive ceremony, attended by important dignitaries from all over South Africa, our very own Mayor, Sipo Thandani proudly opened the Official Launch of South Africa's Blue Flag 2011/2012 Programme.

The ceremony was held at Kariega beach, Kenton-on-Sea, and Ndlambe can be proud of the efforts made by Conservation Officer, Fanie Fouche in ensuring that our municipality was awarded two out of only four Blue Flag beaches in the Eastern Cape.

Blue Flag status is awarded to beaches that comply with Blue Flag criteria through a rigorous application and selection process, both nationally and internationally. Municipalities planning to enter their beaches have to enter

at least one year of what is called a 'pilot phase'. The blue flag programme is designed to raise environmental awareness and increase sound environmental practices among tourists, local



and international. The World Tourism Organisation regards Blue Flag as the most well known eco-label globally with nearly 4,000

sites in over 40 countries.

Deputy Minister of Environmental Affairs, Rejoice Mabudhafasie praised the efforts of municipal staff, councilors and supporting communities in developing their beaches.

Malcolm Powell, international Blue Flag Jury Chairman praised the municipalities present for their high levels of excellence and delivery of services to both local and international visitors.

Malcolm Powell also announced Ndlambe's wish to enter the Royal Alfred Marina and Middle Beach in Kenton as a pilot Flag project for the following season.

Have you noticed the changes taking place in and around Port Alfred?

R-72 Signage: All the old 'illegal' signage has been / or is in the process of being removed. Our new signage will be up towards the end of the month!

Wesley Hill Krans: All the bush around the base of the krans has been removed free of charge by Talisman, The Municipality supplied the Diesel and the project was arranged by Councillor Purdon. Soon light-

ing will be put up in that area
Wharf Street: Angled parking has been placed along the east side, creating more parking for this exciting tourist street.

Port Beacon on Pier: This 'lighthouse' is being replaced making it safer for boats to enter the mouth of the Kowie.

Town Hall: The town hall is in the process of being repainted.

Parking lot in Causeway:

has been cleaned up, providing more and safer parking—all the old brush and bush has been removed.

Road Painting: The roads in and around the CBD are having their road markings repainted.

Golf Course Dam: The walls of the dam have been strengthened and repaired to prevent damage due to flooding.

Based on the applications submitted, designs of the proposed new signage will be submitted to Sunshine Coast Tourism for approval. The signage will have 'Welcome to the Sunshine Coast' on the top and 'slatted' information signage for each of the establishments below. PORT ALFRED'S WATER—BEYOND ADVENTURE ASSISTS

The pungent smell of algae in Port Alfred's water will soon be over. After many tests were taken, it was established that climatic conditions caused the algae which normally lives at the bottom of the holding dam to move to the surface causing a shift in the natural balance of the dam. After a visit to the dam with Ross Purdon and the media, this phenomenon was explained. The water is perfectly drinkable, but the pungent smell of plant material is excessive. Extra workers have been employed to remove the algae from the dam using rakes, however, this is a slow and tedious process.

We approached Peter Brits of Beyond Adventure and requested assistance from his students as the removal of the algae will be made much simpler from canoes. Beyond Adventure have risen to the challenge and the students will be out at the holding dam in their canoes on Monday afternoon!

Many of you will recall the assistance given by the Beyond Adventure students to the Golf Course when the dam burst earlier in the year. How fortunate we are to have these willing and able community minded students in our town! Well done Beyond Adventure!!

Well done to our Ward 10 Councillor Ross Purdon, who has his finger on the pulse.

You can read more about the technicalities in of this process in the local press. However, the good news is the water is perfectly safe, and the municipality has taken steps to remedy the situation.
